

## 2018 TRAINING WORKSHOP ON CONTEXTUALIZING SUPPORT SYSTEM FOR IPEd-SGOD AND IP ELDERS

- 1. The Schools Division of Benguet will conduct the training workshop on contextualizing support system for IPEd-SGOD and SDO-Benguet IP Elders at the Strawberry Hotel and Restaurant, Betag, La Trinidad, Benguet on February 26-28, 2018. Accommodation starts at 3:00 PM on February 25, 2018- First meal shall be served of the same day; last meal is PM snacks of February 28, 2018. Only the training team and IP Elders shall be on live-in status.
- 2. The training workshop aims to:
  - a. orient the participants on the legal and policy basis of the IPEd program including foundational concepts that guide program implementation.
  - b. familiarize the SGOD of their accountabilities and functions in relation to the process of IPEd implementation.
  - c. acquaint the IP elders of their role, duties and responsibilities to the IPEd program.
  - d. Organize the Consultative Advisory Body (CAB) of SDO-Benguet.
- Participants to this training workshop are; SDS, ASDS, SGOD and CID Chief, IPEd Coordinator and Alternate, Education Program Supervisors (One day Only), SGOD personnel, IP Elders per ICC and IPSEO representatives.
- 4. Travel expenses, meals, and other incidental expenses of participants, accommodation and honoraria of IP elders, resource speaker and documenters shall be charged against the Division IPEd Program Support Fund, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
