- 4. Participation of all is enjoined.





MECHANICS:

Conduct of Student-led Hazard Watching and Mapping Video Documentation Contest

Objective:

The contest aims to promote the significance of conducting **Risk Assessment** as one of the bases for School Improvement Planning and to ensure active participation of learners in the school's planning process. The winning entry/ies will also be used as information education and communication (IEC) materials of DepEd-Benguet.

Details and Mechanics:

- 1. This contest is open for secondary schools (JHS and SHS). It is encouraged that there is at least one (1) entry per district.
- 2. Capture a three to five (3-5) minute video on the step by step process of conducting student-led hazard watching and mapping activity. Refer to DepEd Order 23, s. 2015, under *V. Procedures*.
- 3. It is suggested that the video content shall capture the three (3) main parts of the Process:
 - A. Organizing and Preparing the School Watching Team
 - B. Actual School Watching and Hazard Mapping
 - C. Reporting, Submission and Information Dissemination
 - >Voice over should be done by student/learner. Texts to emphasize important words or steps is allowed.
- 4. The entry shall not infringe upon the rights, sensitivities and culture of persons and parties captured in it. Actual photos during conduct of Hazard Watching and Mapping prior to COVID-19 pandemic may be utilized. Just make sure that it is emphasized in the audio or text to follow minimum health protocol when conducting this activity now.
- 5. The video specifications include:
 - At least 720p (1280x720) resolution, 25fps frame rate.
 - Landscape Orientation
 - MP4 format
 - Should be taken using a smartphone (Android or iOS) only.
 - 6. Criteria for judging include:

•	Content (complete, concise, clear)	- 40%
•	Creativity	- 30%
•	Video Production (visual and sound elements/technical aspects)	- 20%
•	Originality	- 10%

MECHANICS:

Conduct of EQ Drill in light of the New Normal Video Documentation Contest

Objective:

The contest aims to increase and promote earthquake preparedness or readiness among the school-community during the COVID-19 pandemic. The winning entry/ies will also be used as information education and communication (IEC) materials of DepEd-Benguet.

Details and Mechanics:

- 1. This contest is open for elementary schools. It is encouraged that there is at least one (1) entry per district.
- 2. Capture a three to five (3-5) minute video on the step by step process of conducting Earthquake Drill to consider EQ drill to be done by parents and learners when at home and school personnel who are on-site.
- 3. It is suggested that the video content shall capture the three (3) main parts of the Process:
 - D. BEFORE (includes planning of School DRRM Team, information dissemination, etc.)
 - E. DURING (Duck-Cover-Hold)
 - F. AFTER (evacuation from inside the house/building to a safe open area/assembly area whether in the school or community; head counting, family reunification (for learners who are in school)

>Voice over should be done by student/learner. Texts to emphasize important words or steps is allowed.

- 4. The entry shall not infringe upon the rights, sensitivities and culture of persons and parties captured in it. Actual photos during conduct of Hazard Watching and Mapping prior to COVID-19 pandemic may be utilized. Just make sure that it is emphasized in the audio or text to follow minimum health protocol when conducting this activity now.
- 5. The video specifications include:
 - At least 720p (1280x720) resolution, 25fps frame rate.
 - Landscape Orientation
 - MP4 format
 - Should be taken using a smartphone (Android or iOS) only.
 - 6. Criteria for judging include:

•	Content (complete, concise, clear)	- 40%

•	Video Production (visual and sound elements/technical aspects)	- 20%
•	Originality	<u>- 10%</u>

ASSESSMENT CHECKLIST FOR SCHOOL'S LANDSLIDE SAFETY

Based on Cordillera RDRRMC Memorandum No. 52, s. 2019

The Assessment Checklist for Schools Landslide Safety with reference to the Landslide Susceptibility Parameters from MGB-CAR is a laymanized (simpler version) checklist to be used in observing geological or environmental indicators within and outside school premises. This is intended for the use of non-geologists.

Objectives:

The objectives of this Assessment Checklist for Schools' Landslide Safety are the following:

- a. Educate stakeholders on observable indicators for possible landslides;
- b. Promote safety measures against landslide,
- c. Support the MGB-CAR in prioritizing more critical areas for assessment;
- d. Serve as prevention and mitigation tool for landslide hazards; and
- e. Use as reference for school improvement planning.

Instruction:

- 1. Using the Attached Annex C-1, conduct an ocular assessment of the school premises (inside and outside the school).
- 2. Accomplish the Google Form using the filled up Annex C-1 as reference, through this link: https://forms.gle/Fr3qzfYaDgAruH579
